As we know, the Wise Men brought gold, frankincense and myrhh to Jesus at his birth. Well, these items are likely beyond our budget.



Scholarship Opportunity

The Baltimore-Washington Conference will once again be offering college scholarships for the Fall 2019 semester. Students can apply January 3 – March 7, 2019 through an online application system. Scholarships are available to students attending or enrolling in accredited colleges and universities in the United States. Students must be an active member of a church for at least one year and be attending (or will attend) an accredited college or university within the United States full-time. Students will need to provide their official transcript (high school or college) and contact information for two church references (pastor and another member of the church). One Call Now System

We use the One Call Now system to send out reminders and announcements of activities, meetings, fund raiser events and other announcements we need to communicate to the congregation. If you miss the message from our One Call you can replay the message by calling the toll free number 1-877-698-3261 and press option "1" to hear the group message. If you are not currently receiving the messages, contact the church office so that we can put you in our system.

Guidelines for use of One Call Now System

The One Call Now system will be used to:

- 1. Announce meetings and activities happening at the church or an activity connected to the Church that is happening elsewhere. (such as Orems members serving a meal at a homeless shelter, etc)
- 2. Alert members to cancelation of church services, meetings or activities due to weather or other circumstances.
- 3. Announce the death of a member or regular attendee to Orems, or a friend of the congregation if the family requests it.
