Maundy Thursday—Worship will be a Seder Meal at 6:00 p.m. at Back River United Methodist Church, where we will join together to find Christ in the Passover.


Good Friday—Worship at 7 p.m. at Orems

A Word From Our Pastor

Greetings Orems

As we move closer to Easter, how is your Lent going? Has it been a time of transformation? A time of change? A time of Spiritual growth?

If not, there is always time to focus on God and seek growth in your relationship with Jesus. Of course, you do not have to only seek Spiritual growth during Lent, but can continue on or begin to seek growth anytime of the year. So take heart, Jesus is there and waiting for you at any time.

However, I do recommend taking time during these last couple of weeks before Easter to deliberately set aside daily time for reading the Bible, prayer, and at least weekly fasting on one morning a week. If you don't know what to read, I suggest reading Luke or John's Gospels. If you read Luke, move on to Acts when you finish. For prayer, even if you pray for just ten minutes a day (remember set apart: this doesn't include driving down the road), let five of those minutes be thanking God for all that you have been given. Thankfulness prayer, as it is called, is powerful and can change your entire outlook on life. Finally, if your doctor allows, fasting in the morning can be a good way to begin fasting. Admittedly, I need to work on my fasting, because I like to eat. Think of it not as sacrifice, but as a way to be filled with God's strength in the Spirit.

So I invite you to join me, or continue on, with these disciplines for the remainder of Lent. I will be fasting on Wednesday mornings, so join me in spirit if you are willing and able and let me know if you are. I'd love to hear how God is working in your life during these 40 days and nights.

And when Easter morning comes around it will be that much sweeter for us when we shout with praise:

"He is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed!"

What a joy we have to look forward to, in Christ.

SLOTH IS NOT A 3-TOED TREE-DWELLING BEAR

Just the sound of the word is painful. It doesn't roll off the tongue as smoothly as other, kinder words does it?

Well yes, the sloth could be a 3-toed bear that lays around and eats ants with its unusual food gathering apparatus. How the bear was named that in first place might tell us more of the creature.

But, sloth is one of the seven deadly sins identified by early church leaders. Its meaning is very broad. As it relates to Stewardship (and it does), we can say it has to do with the following:

"Knowing what to do, and being too lazy to do it."

Being too lazy might be a little harsh. Let's soften that a bit. There are many opportunities in our Church life. Do we take advantage of those opportunities? When we do, we grow. When we don't, we miss that opportunity of growth. Further, when we don't grow, we miss the mark. When we miss the mark, we sin.

Years ago, I didn't look at sin quite that way. Sin was a list of everything I did wrong, and from that, I had a permanent ticket on the Guilt Trip Express. But then the concept of sin defined as 'missing the mark' became evident. Jesus set the mark. God speaks through the Bible clearly: "This is my son in whom I am well pleased. LISTEN TO HIM" (caps are mine). And what does Jesus tell us? "Worship the Lord with all your heart and love your neighbor as yourself." Sounds like a mark to me. How about you?

The Stewardship of time...giving time and energy to those things that make the Church go and grow. Orems has a proud history of volunteerism. Orems can always use more. Our comfort zones get in the way sometimes, because we avoid stepping out and leading or participating.

Most folks don't volunteer because they think they're not qualified, not due to laziness. One thought: God doesn't call qualified people – God qualifies the called!

The closer we get to the mark, the further away we are from sin. The Stewardship of Time...one more thing we <u>get</u> to do for God's Church. Awesome!



If you are a High School Graduate, college student or someone looking to further your education, Orems has scholarships available. Orems scholarship applications must be in by May 14th. You may pick up an application from the office or call the office and we can mail one to you. The criteria for scholarships is enrollment as full time student, member of Orems United Methodist Church, and accepted by a college, University or Trade school in harmony with the moral and ethical position and teachings of the Church. The Willard Ray Scholarship must have approval by Church council. The Scholarship Committee will present the candidates for Scholarship at the next Council meeting. We would like to present the scholarships to our Recipients at the worship service on June 18th.

Ruth Bundick Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship was established by the United Methodist Women to honor a long time member. This fund is supported by the UMW and others who wish to donate to it. Recipients will:

Be a member of Orems UMC

Be accepted by a college, University or full time school (post high school, trade, apprentice). The school must be in harmony with the moral and ethical position and teachings of the Church.

Show evidence of financial need.

Be enrolled as a full time student.

Willard Ray Memorial Scholarship. Established by the estate of long time Orems member Willard Ray. Mr. Ray faithfully modeled strong Christian principles in his personal and professional life. The award is to further the good news of Jesus Christ so that Jesus' followers may go into the world to spread the news of salvation through Christ. It is the goal and focus of this scholarship to further the professional and personal lives of Christians so that they may better serve Jesus all the days of their lives. Those receiving this award are expected to give a high priority to honesty and ethical conduct, and the furthering of their understanding of biblical conduct for their lives.

Recipients will:

Profess Jesus Christ as their Lord and savior.

Live a Christian life as exemplified by the teachings of Jesus understood through biblical principles.

Courses of study should further higher education leading to improvement of employment opportunities, and not furthering recreational, hobbies, or similar activities.

First priority is given to members of Orems who have demonstrated their love for the Lord as evidenced in all they do and say. If no qualified member is chosen, applications for children or grandchildren of members will be considered.
