

# **From Your Pastor**

Hello Orems,

I trust that your Advent is going well and you are preparing yourself for Christ's coming on Christmas. This is an exciting time of year often marked by the highs and lows of the season. Some of the highs might be family get-togethers, decorating the house, or baking cookies, and some of the lows could be the same examples with added stress. As we all know, sometimes getting together with family can be difficult, decorating the house can be frustrating, and baking cookies only works out as long as you don't burn them!

But what I want to focus on is something different than those activities which might stress us out, even though they each have been named the normal activities for the Christmas season in our society. The questions I hope you ponder this Advent is: Why did God come to earth in the flesh? Why is God's incarnation in Jesus so essential to Christianity? Was it just for the beautiful pictures of the Jesus, Mary, and Joseph on Christmas Cards or the Nativity scenes we will see on display all over, or is there something more to its importance? If you are not currently receiving the messages, contact the church office so that we can put you in our system.

# Guidelines for use of One Call Now System

The One Call Now system will be used to:

- Announce meetings and activities happening at the church or an activity connected to the Church that is happening elsewhere. (such as Orems members serving a meal at a homeless shelter, etc)
- 2. Alert members to cancelation of church services, meetings or activities due to weather or other circumstances.
- 3. Announce the death of a member or regular attendee to Orems, or a friend of the congregation if the family requests it.
