From Your Pastor

Greetings Friends,

I hope you had a very Merry Christmas and were able to celebrate the true meaning of the season with loved ones. Christ's coming on Christmas changes everything, and we recognize this in the Church; through the Son of God's incarnation, God comes to be with us. Therefore it can't be said that God is somewhere far away anymore. No, God dwelt among us in the person of Jesus Christ: fully-divine and fully-human.

Of course, many of us exchanged gifts with one another to celebrate Christmas, but I want to ask: what have *you* given to Jesus this Christmas? Better yet, what gift do *you* bring to Christ this Epiphany? Of course, the Epiphany is celebrated in the Church when the three wise men bring the Christ child three gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Each gift signified something: gold was fit for a King, frankincense was fit for a priest, and Myrrh was used as an anointing oil for burial, which foreshadowed Jesus' death and role as a sacrifice for many.

So, what do you bring to Jesus at the beginning of this new year? Perhaps it is spending more time with Him in prayer, or reading the scriptures on a daily basis, or giving more time to serving the least of these: the homeless, the hungry, the poor, the widows, the orphans, the sick, or the imprisoned. Perhaps it is giving more of your money to a mission that you want to support in some way. Or perhaps, it is just opening yourself up to God's working in and through you while being willing to get out of your comfort zone if it means going where God would lead you.

Whatever gift you bring Jesus this year, just remember that this is more than a resolution. Resolutions usually last for a week or two, but they are based on what you are capable of. You see, the gift you might bring Jesus is NOT based on what you can do alone, but is only possible because you are asking God to work in you to make it happen. It is God who can make us more consistent in each of these disciplines or works of love. These gifts are how we live out the gospel while we experience God's grace, and it is only through the power of the Holy Spirit that we can do these things and present them to our Lord.

I pray that you would pray and seek God's direction about this: "what can I bring to the Lord Jesus this year? What can I commit to? Where is God leading me to serve, or give, or love?" Then, after you have sought the Lord's direction on these matters, remember to expect God to act in whichever area you commit to, and seek God's strength through prayer to stay consistent with it.

May the Lord accept your gift this year and magnify it for God's glory! Happy New Year and happy Epiphany Church! May 2017 be a blessed year for us all and may we grow ever closer to the Lord, our God.

We use the One Call Now system to send out reminders and announcements of activities, meetings, fund raiser events and other announcements we need to communicate to the congregation. If you miss the message from our One Call you can replay the message by calling the toll free number 1-877-698-3261 and press option "1" to hear the group message. If you are not currently receiving the messages, contact the church office so that we can put you in our system.

Guidelines for use of One Call Now System

The One Call Now system will be used to:

- 1. Announce meetings and activities happening at the church or an activity connected to the Church that is happening elsewhere. (such as Orems members serving a meal at a homeless shelter, etc)
- 2. Alert members to cancelation of church services, meetings or activities due to weather or other circumstances.
- 3. Announce the death of a member or regular attendee to Orems, or a friend of the congregation if the family requests it.
