We will be working alongside a local Pastor Mercedes Nelson and her members to facilitate a medical mission, a vacation Bible school, and work projects. This mission has been taking place since 2003. Before the evening was over, the sanctuary had been vandalized and set on fire. By 4 am, local fireman had returned to the church to put out a second fire. The vandals had returned. \$75,000 was estimated as the damage. The Sunday service would continue the next day.

they are in great need of support.




