

A Word From Our Pastor

Greetings Orems,

What a wonderful year it has been so far! It is hard to believe that it is already May and we are getting ready for Pentecost, but here we are. I pray that your Lent and Easter has been transformative and you have been drawn into a deeper relationship with God.

As many of you know, Laura and I are going on a mission trip to the Dominican Republic in the beginning of June (June 3-June 10). We are going with a group of people that come from different churches, but the trip is being organized by St. John's Lutheran Church in Bel Air in coordination with Pastor David Jacobson of Lansdowne United Methodist Church.

We will be heading to San Pedro de Macoris, which is on the southern coast of the Dominican Republic, about a 1 hour drive from Santo Domingo, the capital. There we will be working alongside a local Pastor Mercedes Nelson and her people to facilitate a medical mission, a Vacation Bible School, and work projects. This mission has been taking place since 2003. As a result the relationships with the Dominicans in this area are very strong. Let me thank all of you who have contributed financially so far as we are grateful to be able to go on this trip because of the faithful giving and donations of Orems United Methodist Church and its members. We hope to share the light of Christ as we go and serve with the Dominican people in His name and your support has helped us to do that. We would still like to make more financial donations, so if you give to the church and mark it as "Dominican Republic Mission," we can give more money to support the purchase of supplies needed for the trip.

Finally, apart from the money for supplies, we really need your prayers. Honestly, we need your prayers because we are headed to a place where we know we will see severe poverty and illness like we have never seen in our lives. Where, no doubt, our faith will be tested, and where our hearts will be broken for the people. Not only that, but I am sure we will miss our children when we leave them as well. Pray for our family, for us, but especially for the people that we will be serving and serving with. Pray that God would work mightily in the week we are there and that the seeds we plant in this brief time might grow to become all that God wants them to be, and that God's name would be glorified.

Thank you so much, and we look forward to sharing this mission trip with you when we come back, but please know that when we go we take you with us. We are one in Christ Jesus, and for that we give thanks!

STEWARDSHIP ARTICLE MAY 2017 BEACON THE MITZVOT AND OTHER RULES

For Jews, the *Mitzvot* are the commandments of God made real in human lives. There are 613 commandments in the Torah, the first five books of the Bible. Micah reduced that large number to only 3 commandments: do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God (Micah 6:8). The prophets Amos and Habakkuk reduced those three to one. Amos said "Seek me (God) and live." (Amos 5:4) Habakkuk said, "The righteous live by their faith." (Habakkuk 2:4).

In Matthew 22:37-40, Jesus reduced the *Mitzvot* to only 2 commandments: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Our Christian stewardship is enriched by our Jewish heritage. The first, the *Mitzvot*, which contains rules regarding tithing and giving; the second, *tikkun olam* – 'repairing the world". These Jewish laws remind Christians of two essential dimensions of Stewardship – caring for the earth itself and repairing relationships as part of God's human family.

Stewardship is not all about the wallet—only partially so. When Jesus reduced all those commandments to two, He simplified it for all of us. When God speaks through the prophets, He speaks simply and understandably.

But then, we learn that simple is not always easy. And therein are our opportunities of service to our world and in repairing the world. *Tikkun olam* is not easy either. Jesus' commandments give us the path if we will but follow.
