22 Deaf and Hearing people from United Methodist churches in the US (mostly mid-Atlantic states) will continue mission work in the Deaf communities in Kenya and also will attend the 3<sup>rd</sup> International Methodist Deaf Mission Conference in Nairobi. This will be the 6<sup>th</sup> mission trip to work with our partners to form and support the Kenya Deaf ministry and 2 Deaf schools established by the Methodist Church of Kenya. This will be my second mission trip to Kenya. I went in 1998 and it has been 15 years since I have been there and there have been some big changes.

1998	2013
No deaf ministry for Deaf adults other than in a few schools, no HIV testing and education. Begin income-generating projects	Ordained Deaf woman pastor providing full ministry to Deaf people in Kenya. Deaf people trained to test and educate Deaf about HIV. More advanced income-generating projects.
Kaaga Deaf School - no interpreting, teacher's limited signing, kids limited exposure to sign language. No library. Very poor living conditions. 160 residential students.	More interpreting and much higher quality education. Large full library. New classroom building being constructed. Dormitories built to house 160 residential students.
Nija Deaf School - 6 Deaf students in a dismal room with 2 teachers, no sign language at all.  No dorms. Cooking in pot over a fire. Kids walk 10 miles a day to go to school. VERY poor rural area with great people.	120 Deaf students, 16 staff all proficient in Kenyan Sign Language. 18 buildings. 75% of primary school graduates pass gov't test to go to attend high school. Nija 3 <sup>rd</sup> best of the 35 Deaf Schools in Kenyan Sign Language and 8 <sup>th</sup> best overall.

Through Deaf Ministries of the United Methodist churches and the Methodist connection we have been blessed to provide the following and much more;

## Deaf Ministry:

- -Seminary education for Deaf pastor and training for her in Deaf ministry in the US for 3 months (I helped with this one)
- -Support for her family while she was in seminary
- -Advocacy to have her ordained and supported by the Methodist Church of Kenya
- -She is now the President of the International Methodist Deaf Ministries.

## Kaaga Deaf School:

- -a full roof on the Boys Dorm before it caved in
- -in-service education and consultation for the teachers at Kaaga
- -Vacation Bible School and empowerment and role models for the Deaf students
- -teaching materials, library books and equipment for the classrooms.

## Njia Deaf School:

- -salary support for Deaf teacher to bring Kenyan Sign Language to the kids and the teachersfor three years at a rate of \$700/year.(this is her total salary for one year)
- -in-service education and consultation for the teachers at Njia
- -Vacation Bible School and empowerment and role models for the Deaf students
- -teaching materials, library books and equipment for the classrooms
- -beds and bedding and dishes, etc. for a dorm full of students
- -2 cows and chickens to help provide food for the kids

I can't wait to get there to see the improvements and to see what God has for us to work on there!

Pencils, pens, kids scissors, glue, scotch tape, small boxes of crayons Underwear for kids age 4 to adult, any size, for boys and girls. And bras for girls. (Not socks and undershirts)

for sports equipment

for the many needs of the kids and the schools.

To buy beds, mattress and bedding so that Njia can admit more students in their new dorm. For each new student they need \$40 to get each Deaf kid into school and give him/her a "life."

On April 20<sup>th</sup>, we held our second "Tea". The Rachel Circle chaired the event. Menu includes 3 teas, Scones, Strawberry soup, Tomato Basil soup, Salad, sandwiches, Quiche and a fabulous array of desserts. This year was a sell out with 60 people in attendance! The event was a wonderful afternoon of delightful dishes shared with friends and neighbors.

#### For Your Information:

The United Nations defines **human trafficking** as the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring, or receipt of persons by improper means (such as force, abduction, fraud, or coercion) for an improper purpose including forced labor or sexual exploitation.

#### The U.S. Government defines human trafficking as:

Sex trafficking in which a commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion, or in
which the person induced to perform such act has not attained 18 years of age.
 The recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery.

This modern slave trade is a threat to all nations. A grave human rights abuse, it promotes breakdown of families and communities, fuels organized crime, deprives countries of human capital, undermines public health, creates opportunities for extortion and subversion among government officials, and imposes large economic costs.

## Garrison Keillor on "Those People called Methodists"

It was bound to happen. At some juncture a pronouncement would come forth from Lake Wobegon about the second largest Protestant denomination-- namely the family of Methodist Churches. And sadly and indeed humorously, many of the insights are true. So here are some of the highlights (P.S., along the way you discover that Garrison is a Methodist-- which explains a lot! I sprinkle in a few comments of my own along the way in square brackets).

"We make fun of Methodists for their blandness, their excessive calm, their fear of giving offense, their lack of speed, and also for their secret fondness for macaroni and cheese. But nobody sings like them....If you were to ask an audience in New York City, a relatively Methodistless place, to sing along on the chorus of 'Michael row your boat ashore' they would look daggers at you as if you had asked them to strip to their underwear. But if you do this with Methodists, they'd smile and row that boat ashore and up on the beach! And down the road!"

"Many Methodists are bred from childhood to sing in four-part harmony, a talent that comes from sitting on the lap of someone singing alto or tenor or bass and hearing the harmonic intervals by putting your little head against that person's rib cage. Its natural for Methodists to sing in harmony. We are too modest to be soloists, too worldly to sing in unison. When you are singing in the key of C and you slide into the A7th and D7th chords, all two hundred of you, its an emotionally fulfilling moment. By our joining in harmony, we somehow promise that we will not forsake each other."

"I do believe this: People, these Methodists, who love to sing in four-part harmony are the sort of people you could call up when you're in deep distress. If you are dying, they will comfort you. If you are lonely, they will talk to you. And if you are hungry, they will give you tuna salad!" [N.B. That's in the north. In the south its definitely potato salad]

'Methodists believe in prayer, but would practically die if asked to pray out loud." [N.B. I remember a Thanksgiving dinner when my Dad was suddenly asked by Aunt Harriet to say the blessing. Flustered, and unprepared, he said "Dear Lord, please pardon this food and bless our sins, in Jesus' name. Amen" Well Aunt Harriet, never let him live that one down, having spent so many hours in kitchen fixing the meal!]

"Methodists will usually follow the official liturgy, and will feel it is their way of suffering for their sins....You know you are a Methodist if when you watch Star Wars and they say 'May the Force be with you,' you instinctively respond 'And also with you."

"Methodists think that the Bible forbids them from crossing the aisle while passing the peace."

"Methodists believe in miracles and even expect miracles, especially during their stewardship visitation programs or when passing the plate."

"Methodists believe their pastors will visit them in the hospital, even if they don't notify them that they are there!"

"Methodists are willing to pay up to a dollar for a meal at church....They drink coffee as if it were the third Sacrament."

"You will know you are a Methodist when its 100 degrees outside with 90% humidity and you still serve coffee after the service."

"Methodists still serve jello in the proper liturgical color of the season and think that peas in a tuna casserole adds too much color." [especially if you are not in Ordinary time].

"Methodists feel guilty if they don't stay to clean up after their own wedding reception in the Fellowship Hall."

"You know you are a Methodist when doughnuts are a line item in the church budget, just like coffee."

"You know you are a Methodist when it takes at least ten minutes to say goodbye!"
