

Dear Church

It's February and as I write this (the end of January), we are only one month into winter. I surely don't want to wish my life away, but I am soooo ready for spring! I DO love the change of seasons, but quite frankly, I'm tired of shoveling snow and I'm tired of single digit temperatures. I know many of you share that same sentiment.

When I think of February, I think of the celebration of Black History Month, Lincoln's Birthday, and President's Day. Girls (and guys, you should too) think about Valentine's Day as well. Valentine's Day is a day that brings expectation, fear, and sadness together in one celebration. I doubt you would find that definition in a dictionary since I made it up. Why do I define Valentine's Day

like that? Well, on Valentine's Day some look forward to the opportunity to share their love with someone else. Some are afraid they won't be able to communicate the depth of their love. Fasten your seat belts because there will be a few bumps along the

way as we take our whole range of human experience and emotions to God in psalm prayer. This journey mirrors Jesus' march toward Jerusalem, Good Friday, and Easter. Be prepared to stretch your understanding of prayer and of faith along the way.

I can't think of a time when Christians have needed to study and pray the psalms more than right now. We live in a culture of hype -- everything is over the top and in your face. We live in an atmosphere of fear -- of terrorists, snipers, product contamination, identity theft, strange diseases that are medically resistant, home invasions, and dwindling retirement funds. We are over stimulated and distracted by scandals, things to buy, and foreign wars and uprisings. How can we find God in the middle of such a world as this? How can we envision the kind of world that God intends for us?

The figurative, image-laden language of the Psalms can help and Lent is a perfect time to do this.
