
Gardens to beautify Entrance to the Church

You may know that the money you give in your offering envelope goes to help pay utilities, supplies and salaries. But have you thought about how we pay for repairs and upkeep of our building complex?



Our next meeting will be May 13th at 11 a.m. We hope all will be well and able to attend our meeting.


COMING SOON... A NEW BIBLE STUDY

The Christ-Centered Woman: Finding Balance in a World of Extremes

Led by Mrs. Nikki Hart

Sometimes the commitments and pace of daily life can make us feel as if we're on a whirling merry-go-round and dangerously close to losing our sense of balance — or being flung off altogether. We need to discover a calm center from which to handle the distracting forces of life that seek to move us away from what is truly important.

In this six-week Bible study, Kimberly Reisman provides an in-depth guide to finding balance at every age and stage of life. Rather than the typical self-help solutions the world offers, she leads us to the biblical answer to stress and imbalance: living a Spirit-filled, Christ-centered life. Using a wheel as a metaphor for the journey to a Christ-centered life, she identifies barriers to balanced living and explores what the Bible teaches



about Christ-centered living – showing s in practical terms how placing Christ at the center of our lives leads to the wholeness and balance God desires for us.

The participant book guides women in daily personal study and the interactive format includes space for responding to questions and recording personal reflections.

Classes include the following topics: 1. Good Enough, 2. Temperance, 3. Self-Discovery, 4. Authenticity, 5. Calling, 6. Power and Purpose, and 7. Flexibility.

A sign-up sheet will be circulated on Sunday mornings. The cost for the participant book is \$10. Class will be offered on Tuesday afternoons from 2pm to 3:30pm.

Cell Phones are still being collected as a fundraising mission through GRC recycling. There is a box in the connecting hallway to collect your unwanted cell phones.




One Call Now System



Thank you to everyone who worked to make this event a success. A special thanks go to our very own Easter Bunny.



Dottie Glenn Lecture Series presents Dr. Paul L. Maier with a seminar hosted by St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Bowleys Quarters Saturday, May 17, 2014



CHRISTIANITY ACROSS THE CENTURIES -- A Bird's-Eye View How did our faith become the most successful phenomenon of all time? It helps to step back and take a wide-angle view of church history.

Dr. Paul L. Maier recently The Russell H. Seibert Professor of Ancient History at Western Michigan University, retired. He is the Second Vice-President of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and a much-published author of both scholarly and popular works. His novels include two historical documentaries: *Pontius Pilate* and *The Flames of Rome*, as well as a theological thriller that became # 1 national bestseller in religious fiction: *A Skeleton in God's Closet*. A sequel, *More Than a Skeleton*, appeared in 2003. And a third novel, the *Constantine Codex* was released in 2011. His non-fiction works include *In the Fullness of Time*, a book that correlates secular evidence from the ancient world impinging on Jesus and early Christianity; *Josephus -- The Essential Works*, a new translation/commentary on writings of the first-century Jewish historian; and *Eusebius -- The Church History*, a similar book on the first Christian historian. More than five million Maier books are now in print in fifteen languages, as well as over 250 scholarly articles and reviews in professional journals. Dr. Maier lectures widely, appears frequently in national radio, television, and newspaper interviews, and has received numerous awards. He has also penned four children's books, and produced three four-hour video series dealing with Jesus, St. Paul, and the early church.

Henderson Settlement

"Meeting basic needs in Appalachia since 1925

Henderson Settlement was originally founded as a school in 1925 by Methodist minister Hiram Frakes in what would later become Frakes, Kentucky. Shortly thereafter, a dormitory was added to provide housing for students and a church was built. Under the management of Tex Evans in the 1950s and 1960s, Henderson Settlement expanded their agricultural program and set up a work camp for volunteers. In the late 1960s and 1970s, Henderson was a part of the federal War on Poverty, adding more social services such as a volunteer fire department, an early childhood development center and a health clinic. From the 1980s until today, Henderson has focused on sustaining community activities for everyone through youth ministries to senior housing. In addition, Henderson still hosts hundreds of volunteers at their work camps every year, continuing the tradition of service in Appalachia.

With 66 backyard gardens, four greenhouses and two community gardens, Henderson Settlement hosts the largest number of Grow Appalachia gardens. They also have a commercial kitchen, a farmers' market and a herd of cattle and goats to round out their food-producing capabilities.


Grow Appalachia's grant allows organizations like, Henderson Settlement, to add personalized service to their clients who may have already been gardening in the community, but did not have the resources to have their own gardens at home. to last the winter. The commercial kitchen at the Henderson Settlement hosts cooking and canning classes to help other growers process food to be made into jams, salsas, pickles or other value added goods that can then be sold on site at the farmers' market.

Henderson Settlement is a one-stop sustainable food shop.


