Happy New Year Orems!

I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and New Years and are ready to grow your spiritual life in 2016. We have a new theme for 2016 and it comes from James 5:16:

"Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

We have selected prayer as a focus for 2016 because of what James says here: prayer is powerful and it is effective! I realize that many of you already pray on a regular, if not daily, basis, but what we want to look at this year is how we pray, who we pray for, our readiness to pray at any moment, and how we can grow in our prayer life together.

Corrie Ten Boom has an interesting quote about prayer where she asks, "Is prayer your steering wheel or your spare tire?" For many of us, whether we realize it or not, prayer has become a spare tire and something that we use only in emergencies. Rather than using prayer in this way, God has called us to make prayer the steering wheel of our lives by letting God guide us in life through our prayer. Therefore we are not called to ask God only for things and needs, but we must also listen to what God has to say to us.

I understand that life can be very busy but the busyness of life is precisely a reason as to why we need to take time to pray more! Martin Luther said, "I have so much to do that I shall spend the first three hours [of my day] in prayer." If prayer is our steering wheel, shouldn't we be praying as if things really can change? Shouldn't our prayer be a source of strength for our lives? Prayer should be the foundation for a Christian life.

So, I invite you to join me in a year of prayer. Let us focus our prayers on the world, our country, our state, our city, our community, and our own lives. I invite you to start thinking about what you are going to be praying for during Lent, as it begins on February 10<sup>th</sup>. Laura and I make a list of five things that we pray about daily and lift before God during Lent each year. In years past we have prayed for all sorts of things and have seen our prayers answered. Last year, one of our prayers was for a smooth transition from being a family of four to a family of five, and through God's grace our prayer has been answered so far.

What will you pray for during Lent? Take the time to think and pray about this while asking God to put people and needs on your heart, write them down, and put them in a place where you see them every day so that you remember to pray for them.

In the meantime, continue to pray for one another and for our community, and ask

God how we can be better servants to our neighbors around us.

#### One Call Now System

We use the One Call Now system to send out reminders and announcements of activities, meetings, fund raiser events and other announcements we need to communicate to the congregation. If you miss the message from our One Call you can replay the message by calling the toll free number 1-877-698-3261 and press option "1" to hear the group message. If you are not currently receiving the messages, contact the church office so that we can put you in our system.

#### **Guidelines for use of One Call Now System**

The One Call Now system will be used to:

- Announce meetings and activities happening at the church or an activity connected to the Church that is happening elsewhere. (such as Orems members serving a meal at a homeless shelter, etc)
- 2. Alert members to cancelation of church services, meetings or activities due to weather or other circumstances.
- 3. Announce the death of a member or regular attendee to Orems, or a friend of the congregation if the family requests it.
