
You never know what a word of gratitude will do in a person's life. It may just make them more thankful for something too.


Our next meeting is Wednesday, November 4th at 7:00 p.m. Please join us as we continue to plan for our missions and ministries.







Financial Committee Update

This update is to let you know what has been replaced this year. We have purchased a new boiler in the Fellowship hall and replaced 2 oil tanks for just over \$42,000. We also replaced the main door to the Fellowship hall building-the original door hardware stopped locking and unlocking and could no longer be repaired. The new door cost just under \$7000.00. Both the boiler and the door were 57 years old.

Major projects are paid through our Capital Improvement funds not our General Budget that is supplied by your weekly offerings. While we have some money in our Capital Improvement fund, we still have several costly items that need replaced or fixed over time to improve our facility for the future. Capital Improvement fund donations can be given in the white envelope in your pews, simply mark it for Capital Improvements.
