Greetings Orems!

As many of you know we have been working through the Gospel of Luke since the beginning of September in worship and I hope that this has been informational for you. For this series, I have been focusing on specific teachings of Jesus because I think they are instrumental to a life lived in faith.

These teachings are certainly instructional for us as followers of Christ, but we should not leave them as such. They are not merely teachings to give us an example of how to live as a Christian but so much more than that!






