A Word From Our Pastor

Greetings Orems,

I hope that you are doing well and made it safely through the snow storm last week. Laura, the kids, and I were snowed in at our house, but the break in our routine gave us time to be together as a family. It also gave me more time to think about Lent. As we draw closer to the liturgical season of Lent, have you begun to think about what you will do to try to draw closer to God this year? I think I mentioned it last year, but Laura and I usually put together a list of five prayers that we pray for each day during Lent. We write out our list and put it somewhere we both can see it, so we remember to take time to pray each day.

Speaking of prayer, we will be offering a Bible study during Lent called, *Before Amen: The Power of a Simple Prayer.* This is a Max Lucado Bible study that I will be leading for four consecutive Thursdays during Lent: February 18, 25, March 3rd, and March 10th. I will be leading our conversations at both a 10:30-11:30AM time and a 7PM time. Hopefully one of these times will work for you to attend. Please let the office know if you plan to attend; the cost of the study guide is around \$10.

While this Bible study is not a Lenten study, per se, prayer is something that we always need to be doing and be ready to do. It isn't just an activity for the particularly pious, or for when we are in trouble, but it is something we should be doing constantly. Lent is a time for us to intentionally focus on our prayer and spiritual life in relationship to God through Jesus Christ. In Luke chapter four, we are told that Jesus was in the wilderness for forty days and nights, and during that time he was tempted by Satan to sin but we know that Jesus did not sin. It was his prayer and his knowledge of scripture that kept him strong.

So what will you do to draw closer to God this Lent? I ask you to pray about joining us for this Bible study. Seek God's direction for what God wants you to do to draw closer to him this Lent. Is it prayer or getting back into reading your devotional every day? Or, could it be giving something up that you know is preventing you from having a more full relationship with God? It could also be something else. Don't just think about these questions, but pray about them, lifting them up before the Lord. God is there and is listening; for God is always with us and wants us to draw closer. I pray that your Lent is a great journey and that you grow in Christ throughout!


