

A Word From Our Pastor

Greetings Orems,

I hope that all of you have heard by now that as of July 1, 2018, I will no longer be the pastor of Orems UMC and have been reappointed to serve in a different ministry setting. This change of appointment was made by Bishop Easterling in consultation with our District Superintendent, and the rest of the BWC cabinet. This announcement was made back in February during worship.

During these past four years since I was appointed in July 2014 we have laughed and cried together, have



shared life and ministry together, and we have grown in Christ together. I am so grateful and feel incredibly blessed to have served alongside each of you here at this wonderful and historic church. You all have been a blessing to Laura, our children, and myself in so many ways. Leaving is going to be tough, but I trust in God's provisions and do look forward to what lies in store for Orems. God has begun something that I pray you all will continue to live into. God is surely in this place!

As some of you know, and others who are new to Methodism might not, there are formal policies of pastoral transition that the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference expects all of us to maintain as we all transition. The following rules are The Baltimore Washington Conference are to be followed concerning our relationship beginning July 1st:

1. As of the effective date of a new appointment, a pastor shall immediately cease all pastoral counseling and pastoral visitation with members or member families in the previous appointment. Since appointments are generally announced several weeks in advance, each pastor has adequate time in which to effect closure and make appropriate referral to another for the pastoral care of members.

2. Pastors shall have a clear understanding with former congregations that they will not return to officiate at baptisms, weddings, and funerals, or do pastoral counseling or pastoral visitation in that parish. Pastors, active or retired, shall respectfully decline to participate in such duties when invited by members of a former congregation. Declining all such invitations is the responsibility of the previous pastor. The present pastor, at his or her discretion, may invite the previous pastor to return for pastoral functions. However, the present pastor should never be under any pressure to invite the previous pastor.

3. Through transitions in pastoral leadership, local congregations should be educated concerning this policy and asked to support it by prayer and actions. Pastors all agree to honor these policies. When they do not, the ministry and pastoral authority of the newly appointed pastor is undermined, and it is more difficult for the new pastor and members of the congregation to form a good working relationship.

In addition, the pastor who has moved and comes back takes away from his/her

new congregation by spending time and effort going back, rather than spending that time and effort in their new appointment. Neither of these patterns is healthy. I agree with and fully support the policy stated above. True friendships can continue but can no longer be based on pastoral roles and relationships.

Just so you are aware my last Sunday in the pulpit will be June 10, but I will continue to work in the office the remainder of that week. Norris Tingle and Pixie Faulkner have volunteered to preach the remaining two Sundays of June. As soon as we know who your new pastor will be, we will begin to specifically pray for him or her. Until then, I ask you to pray for whoever it may be, as God already knows. In the meantime I am grateful that I will remain your pastor as we finish our season together. I will reflect on this in the next newsletter, but for now...know that I will continue to pray for you all and that if you need anything, just let us know.

How to Have the Best Pastor, as shared by Rev. Ann Adams (2014)

Your pastor will be as good as you pray him or her to be!

Your help is vital,

NOT in talking to your pastor about what you think should be their work in the church,

NOT in telling other people what you like or dislike about the pastor's personality, workstyle, sense of humor, or ability to meet your needs,

BUT in talking to God about your pastor's relationship to God and to his calling.

Every good pastor has a network of praying people who are holding him/her up in prayer, even when they do not understand what the pastor is doing or why. The most ineffective pastor can be transformed by the power of committed prayer by supportive people, who take on the responsibility with joy.

How to Pray for your Pastor

Pray <u>believing</u> that God wants your pastor to be **all that God has called them to be.**

Pray <u>believing</u> that God will enable your pastor to be(come) **all that God plans for them to be.** Pray <u>believing</u> that God has sent this pastor for your **mutual benefit:**

that the pastor may help you grow in Christ's likeness,

and that you may help your pastor grow in Christ's likeness.

What to Pray for your Pastor

1) Pray for *power in preaching.* Power is the work of the Holy Spirit, in and through the message, reaching and changing hearts, minds, attitudes, and behaviors. **Power send people forth to live as God's children.**

2) Pray for *confirming signs*. Confirmation comes through life-changing experiences that draw people into the presence of God, into closer communion with God's people, and in deepening commitment to share the gospel in the world. Some signs are dramatic. Others are subtle. **God give the signs that are needed for individual situations**.

3) Pray for *enduring results*. Growing maturity and a longing to know God and do God's will are the mark of discipleship. A disciple gives 168 hours a week to living as a Christian. A disciple knows how to feed himself/herself, and how to feed others. A disciple does not concentrate on what he/she can receive, but on what she/he can give.

4) Pray for *steadfast single-mindedness.* The pastor's primary task is to equip the saints for the work of ministry. When you pray for the pastor to be single-minded, you are praying that she/he will concentrate on preparing you to be the people of God, ministering in the world. It is Easy for a pastor to become distracted by doing "church work" and neglect the primary calling of equipping the saints to do the work of the church.

5) Pray for *protection from spiritual attack.* As long as the congregation and the pastor are content with the status-quo, life moves along smoothly. When you pray your pastor through points 1 -4, the forces of evil will not be silent. The prayers of God's people can bind the enemy, who is already defeated through Christ's victory. **We have no reason to fight battles that have already been won on our behalf.** We need to claim the victory that is already ours. God has not given us the spirit of fear or defeatism, but of power, love, and soundness of mind and heart. **God will protect us within and without.**

I know we do not yet know who your pastor will be, but in the meantime I ask that you would follow these principles of praying for your new pastor. All of you who prayed for me, using these guidelines that Rev. Ann asked of you helped me in so many ways. Please do the same for your next pastor, and please start today. Continue being as much a blessing to him or her, as you have been to me.

UNFORTUNATELY, THERE ARE SCAMMERS POISED TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF MEDI-CARE RECIPIENTS. SOMEONE FROM "MEDICARE" MAY CALL TO TELL YOU THAT YOU ARE GETTING A NEW MEDICARE CARD. BUT UNTIL IT COMES, THEY WILL CLAIM THAT YOU NEED A TEMPORARY CARD. THEY WILLL ALSO CLAIM THAT THE FEE FOR THAT TEMPORARY CARD IS \$5-50 DOLLARS. THEY WANT PERSONAL INFORMATION SUCH AS BANK ACCOUNT OR CREDIT CARD NUMBER SO THEY CAN PROCESS YOUR TEMPORARY CARD.

HANG UP! DO NOT GIVE THEM ANY INFORMATION

REMEMBER: MEDICARE WILL NEVER CALL YOU UNLESS YOU ASK THEM TO. MEDICARE DOES ALL COMMUNICATION BY MAIL UNLESS YOU ASK THEM TO CALL.

Stewardship moment

So, when did the concept of stewardship actually begin. At the beginning, of course! Genesis 1:1-31 – When you have a moment, read the first 31 verses of Chapter 1. God is pretty clear about stewardship and what it means.

Vs. 26 is most interesting. The common English bible (also known as CEB) reads: then God said " let <u>us</u> make humanity in <u>our</u> image to resemble <u>us</u> so that they may take charge of the fish of the sea... etc" Us? Wesley, like most theologians of the day assumed this to be Father, Son and Holy Ghost--the trinity. Most translations read pretty much the same way.

So, humanity was charged with taking care of the earth and all that dwells therein. How that has developed into today's concept of stewardship is a matter of great discussion. The fact is God put us in charge and it's up to us to take care of the planet.

The concept of our time, talent and gifts isn't far behind. That's why it is in our commitment for joining the United Methodist Church. It's how we've lasted since 1773.
