

From Your Pastor

Greetings Friends,

Advent is upon us again and we look forward to Christ's coming on Christmas. I read this story recently and wanted to share it with you as we wait on the Lord.

Once upon a time there was an old, old monk who had become the revered abbot of a monastery. One day a very young and enthusiastic monk came to question him about his life. "Father," he asked, "in all these years of prayer and discipline, of early rising and penance, have you become enlightened or holy?"

The old abbot broke into peals of laughter, saying, "If you have to ask, isn't it obvious? No, I've not become all that holy. And wisdom or enlightenment? I don't know. Sometimes it's hard enough just to survive day-to-day with some sort of gracefulness. To learn wisdom as well is asking for a lot."

But the young monk was serious and pushed him: "Then why do you stay? Have you learned nothing in all these years?"

The old monk eyed him seriously and answered, "Well, yes, I have learned one thing about God. Stay awake! You never know when God is going to decide to come and visit you. Stay awake! You never know when all your carefully laid and detailed plans will be derailed, when your patterns and routines will be rudely interrupted. Stay awake! Don't fall asleep this Advent by focusing on the world and all it would offer you instead of Christ for Christmas, but stay awake and focus on what Jesus has already given you, and will one day bring into being on his return.

Christ wants to be the center of your life. Don't be caught off guard on his coming, stay awake and let him be the center now. Let your Christ-mas be full of Christ. Let Jesus be the center of it all, but first we wait...so, stay awake.

Gross or Net? That is the Question

Ever since we were wee pups, the question has been: when tithing, do we use gross or net?

In many cases, we could say gross, net or if!

The 10% tithe has been in place since early in Genesis. Abram—who became Abraham—had soundly defeated his enemies and God directed that he give 10% of his spoils (of war) to Melchizedek, a high priest. Now this precedes the Israelite nation who would descend from Abraham. It was at this time that God made his Covenant with Abraham that his descendants would be his people. It is also the time that is referenced so often during the current study of Exodus.

Therefore, this 10% had come down through the ages in Judaism as the tithe. Of course, there was also the Temple tax and other gifts that were expected. And to-day, we struggle under this 10% number. However, the Israelites never expected Gentiles to participate in the tithe, and therefore were exempt. The issue of gross or net becomes moot.

And so today, we can safely look to John Wesley for guidance—and his guidance makes perfect sense:

EARN ALL YOU CAN - SAVE ALL YOU CAN - GIVE ALL YOU CAN

Perhaps we could also add a fourth: AS YOUR HEART LEADS YOU. The needs are great. Resources are what they are. We do the best that we can as we are called.






