STEWARDSHIP MARCH 2018 STEWARDSHIP OF TIME

In this Season of Lent, there's an example of Stewardship we might not even think about: Jesus Christ himself.

Jesus was on the earth for a total of 33 years, but only 3 of those years were about his ministry. The other 30 years are subjects of speculation and guesswork. Nothing is really recorded—that we know of. We know that Jesus worked as a carpenter with Joseph in Nazareth. We assume he was a normal child, excepting perhaps the time he was at the Temple, aged 12 as the Bible tells us.


Now, some current pundits have suggested what happened to Jesus. Some of the movies presented by Hollywood over the years have glamorized different pictures of him, but only as imagined by people who do that sort of thing for a living. The Last Temptation of Christ comes to mind—really??

However, only 3 years were spent in ministry. Doing what? Changing the world! That world was a lot smaller then and if we come forward 20 centuries or so, the effect of that change has multiplied. Could anyone have predicted the effects of Jesus' actions from then until now?

Could we think of a 3 year period of our lives that would dare to compare? The short answer is no! Jesus' time was spent healing the sick—of mind and spirit, training his disciples to follow his teachings, and it didn't matter what time of day or night these things happened. He was the ultimate time management expert. Jesus knew what had to be done because he knew the timeframe he had. When Jesus breathed his last on the cross and said "It is finished", did he mean his life, his mission, or both?





What is Tenebrae? What is a Tenebrae service?"

The word *Tenebrae* is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness." It can also be translated as "night" or "death." The Tenebrae service is an ancient tradition in Christian history that took place on one of the last three days of Holy Week: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, or Holy Saturday. The purpose of this service was to remember the somber events that occurred in Jesus' life from the exuberant entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday through the night of Jesus' <u>burial</u> on Good Friday.

The most distinctive aspect of the service is the use of a Tenebrae "hearse," a holder for several lit candles. The flames of these candles are extinguished one by one as Scripture readings are shared to tell the story of Holy Week. This gradual descent into gloom is a representation of Jesus' increasing sorrow as the events of Passion Week unfolded. After the last verse is read, the last candle is put out, and the room is plunged into darkness.

A loud noise may be sounded in the blackness, such as the violent closing of a book, to represent the closing of Christ's tomb. At this point, another lit candle, which has been hidden from view, is put at the top of the hearse, symbolizing Christ's resurrection. The service ends, and the participants are traditionally expected to leave in contemplative silence.

Join us Good Friday as our Choir presents a Tenebrae service in word and song.
