I guess I wrote a little more than I intended. Forgive me.  ${igodot}$ 



#### **STEWARDSHIP IN DIFFICULT TIMES...AGAIN\*\***

Hurricanes, flooding, property loss, poverty, needs of our neighbors: these are all the situations that vie for our attention and help.

Fixed incomes, rising costs of food, housing and utilities: these are things that stand in the way of the giving that folks would like to do.

#### WHAT TO DO?

Pastor Chris has repeatedly reminded us that it is difficult to give to all the requests made of the congregation. It is not expected. We can also take heart in that since we are a connectional church, our giving, regardless of amount, is multiplied by other UMC churches into significant assistance. Add to that the community church support of the local mission efforts are likewise combined for good effect.

The first and primary giving is to our own church first. This keeps our facilities and programs of showing the Good News healthy and functioning. We should give to the other outreach programs as we feel led by God and our own abilities to do so. Choose a request that speaks to your own heart. Consider smaller amounts to more requests. If not money, give your time to programs like Streets of Hope and others that are available. We certainly have a target rich environment for consideration.

None of us are philanthropists and no one named J.P. Morgan sits in our congregation. But together, we can make a difference when we multiply our giving this way. And if you cannot give, pray. We have a place for that too, don't we?
