

STEWARDSHIP IS "ALL IN"*

There is an old story—apochryphal perhaps—that during medieval times when the army of a Christian nation would conquer a non-Christian land, everyone from the King to the lowliest peasant would have to be baptized as one of the terms of surrender. The story goes that as the soldiers would go into the river to be baptized, they would hold their right arm out of the water so that every part of their body—except their sword arm—was under the command of Christ. This caused an old preacher to ask his congregation, "What are you holding out of the water?"

United Methodist Christians are "All In", we hold nothing "out of the water". We recognize that all we are and all we have belongs to God, and that we are using—managing—the blessings God has showered upon us. The Bible says it this way: "Every good gift, every perfect gift, comes from above. These gifts come down from the Father, the creator of the heavenly lights, in whose character there is no change at all." (James 1:17) In "Churchspeak", we call that stewardship which comes from the ancient understanding that everything belongs to the King; and "Stewards" manage those resources for the King's benefit.

Stewardship is the core understanding of our membership vows as we commit to supporting the ministries of our church with our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. When you think about it, those five things—prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness—represent the sum total of who we are. United Methodist Christians go "All In" for Jesus!
