#### STEWARDSHIP BEACON ARTICLE – JUNE, 2019 SOME RANDOM THOUGHTS ON PRAYER

C. S. Lewis once wrote, "There are only two kinds of people: those who say to God, 'Thy will be done,' and those to whom God says, 'All right, then, have it your way." Sometimes, we tend to pray more when we are under severe stress. Those times of trials: passing of a friend or family, on receiving a poor diagnosis of an illness, and even before a test or exam. Yet, the Bible urges us to be in prayer always. There was a Facebook post that suggested we pray on the way to the store, going out to dinner or even taking a shower. In fact, that post was making the point that Sunday wasn't the only day or time for prayer.

Thomas Ken in 1674 wrote the words to our Doxologies, Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow. We sing this as the Pastor places the Offering Plates on the altar. It is a prayer to God praising Him for His blessings on us, "here below". This is not a prayer of asking, but one of pure praise.

This grand old doxology was sung by the starving boys in blue [Union soldiers in the Amer-i-can civil war] that were incarcerated in Lib-by Prison [Rich-mond, Virgin-ia]. Day after day, they saw comrades passing away, and their numbers increased by fresh, living recruits for the grave. One night about ten o'clock, through the stillness and the darkness, they heard the tramp of coming feet, that soon stopped before the prison door until arrangements could be made inside. In the company was a young Bap-tist minister, whose heart almost fainted as he looked on those cold walls and thought of the suffering inside. Tired and weary, he sat down, put his face in his hands and wept.

Just then a lone voice of deep, sweet pathos, sung out from an upper window—Praise God from whom all blessings flow; and a dozen manly voices joined in the second line—Praise Him all creatures here below and then by the time the third was reached, more than a score of hearts were full, and these joined to send the words on high—Praise Him above ye heavenly host; and by this time the prison was all alive, and seemed to quiver with the sacred song, as from every room and cell those brave men sang—Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

As the song died out on the still night that enveloped in darkness the doomed city of Richmond, the young man arose and happily said—"Prisons would palaces be if Jesus would dwell with me there!"

Finally, some words from our own Prayer Room walls:

GOD'S ANSWER TO PRAYER: 1. YES; 2. NO; 3. I HAVE SOMETHING BETTER IN MIND.


