It is now possible to give your offering on a recurring basis or a single donation to Orems Church through ShelbyNext systems.

You may do this with a credit or debit card or ACH (withdrawal) or an echeck. The system charges 2.7% of your donation as a convenience fee. You do not have to pay this fee. There is a box to check if you wish to include this. If you use echeck or ACH the fee charged to the church is smaller but the online system does not differentiate between the Credit/debit convenience fee and lesser fees. If you want to use echeck or ACH do not check off that you will cover the convenience fee. For these types of donations the fee is less than 1% of your donation. It would be better for you to make a cash donation to the church at a later time in person for that small amount then to be charged 2.7%.

If you prefer to mail your donation or drop off your offering, we now have a locked mailbox to keep your donations secure. It is located outside the center entrance to the connecting hallway. Or you can drop off donations on Tuesday and Thursday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The Task to Re- Open Orems Church

We have been directed by the Bishop to form a "Re-Entering Well Task Force" to plan for a phased-in reopening of our building(s) for church gatherings. This Team includes the Pastor Gail, Members of the Board of Trustees, Pastor/Staff-Parish Relations Committee Chair, Media Presentation Representative, our Administrative Assistant, Worship Chair and our Health team chair. This team is meeting frequently by Zoom remotely to review updated information regarding reopening. Their work will be informed by the local health department and CDC guidelines.

Before congregations gather, each church must be able to do the following:

• Obtain adequate amounts of cleaning and sanitization products. Alcohol-based surface cleaners are adequate to kill this virus as long as they are 60% or higher in alcohol content. All surfaces (door knobs, light switches, walls, railings, pews, floors, etc.) with a possible risk of touch must be sanitized. And be able to adhere to all CDC and local health guidelines to mitigate risk.

• Obtain an adequate number of masks for anyone who does not arrive wearing their own. People refusing to wear a mask must be asked to leave and join the service virtually.

• Provide hand sanitizer for those who do not have it and/or install touchless hand sanitizer dispensers at entrances/exits.

• Address the fact that microphones, keyboards, handheld electronic devices, and other surfaces may be difficult to clean or disinfect because they could be damaged if they became wet. A cleanable cover/ skin (e.g., keyboard skin) could be used on the item to allow for cleaning while protecting the item. We must ensure that each microphone will be used by one person during a gathering; they may not be passed from person to person. Sanitize the microphones after each gathering.

• Create signage that assists in communicating core safety messages in a way that is hospitable and caring.

• Consider that nothing can be passed from person to person. Offering plate must be stationary so that donations can be dropped into the plate. No bulletins or Hymnals will be used as they can not be sanitized.

One person must record each person attending and contact information for anyone who enters a service so that they can be traced if there is a virus breakout in your congregation.

Consider the percentage of congregants who are vulnerable to the virus, and take into account the high degree of discipline that will be necessary in order for the pastor and congregation to be vigilant about adhering to guidelines and helping others do the same.

Consider the size and configuration of your space(s) including parking lots, foyers, sanctuaries, bathrooms, elevators, classrooms, etc. and what that means in terms of meeting health guidelines.

Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we know that many people have lost their jobs, been laid off, or had their hours and benefits reduced. When that happens, most people have just two options available - pay for their healthcare through COBRA (which is incredibly expensive), or just go without coverage. Neither option seems like a good one. However, there is an alternative. Brian Hyde of Christian Insurance Partners, has found a **Short Term Medical Plan** that can provide great healthcare coverage at a reasonable cost for most people. DID YOU KNOW THAT OREMS HAS TWO SCHOLARSHIPS?

Yes we do. Ruth Bundick and Willard Ray Scholarships are established from Memorials for two long time members of Orems Church. Each Scholarship has its own qualifications.

If you are a High School Graduate, college student or someone looking to further your education, Orems has scholarships available. DEADLINE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS: <u>Orems scholarship applications must be in by June 28th.</u> You may pick up an application from the office or call the office and we can mail one to you. The criteria for scholarships is enrollment as full time student, member of Orems United Methodist Church, and accepted by a college, University or Trade school in harmony with the moral and ethical position and teachings of the Church. The Willard Ray Scholarship must have approval by Church council. The Scholarship Committee will present the candidates for Scholarship at the May Council meeting. We will present the scholarships to our Recipients at a later date this summer.

Ruth Bundick Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship was established by the United Methodist Women to honor a long time member. This fund is supported by the UMW and others who wish to donate to it. Recipients will:

Be a member of Orems UMC

Be accepted by a college, University or full time school (post high school, trade, apprentice). The school must be in harmony with the moral and ethical position and teachings of the Church.

Show evidence of financial need and be enrolled as a full time student.

Willard Ray Memorial Scholarship. Established by the estate of long time Orems member Willard Ray. Mr. Ray faithfully modeled strong Christian principles in his personal and professional life. The award is to further the good news of Jesus Christ so that Jesus' followers may go into the world to spread the news of salvation through Christ. It is the goal and focus of this scholarship to further the professional and personal lives of Christians so that they may better serve Jesus all the days of their lives. Those receiving this award are expected to give a high priority to honesty and ethical conduct, and the furthering of their understanding of biblical conduct for their lives.

Recipients will:

Profess Jesus Christ as their Lord and savior.

- Live a Christian life as exemplified by the teachings of Jesus understood through biblical principles.
- Courses of study should further higher education leading to improvement of employment opportunities, and not furthering recreational, hobbies, or similar activities.
- First priority is given to members of Orems who have demonstrated their love for the Lord as evidenced in all they do and say. If no qualified member is chosen, applications for children or grandchildren of members will be considered.

The Orems Council has final approval of the selected recipient.
