The Hall Closet Thrift Shop announces plans to reopen its doors. August 7th

The last time the Thrift Shop was open for customers was March 2020. Covid 19 and Social Distancing shut the shop down for over a year.

Now that things are starting to open up more it is time to consider the steps to take to reopen the shop. The staff has met to discuss the safest and best possible way to open for business.

August 7th at 8:30 a.m. the Hall Closet will open it's doors. There will be some rules to follow to ensure the smooth movement in the shop and the safety of our volunteer staff and customers. Due to the close quarters in the shop, Masks must be worn at all times while in the Hall Closet thrift shop until further notice.

At this time, we will not be accepting new donations for the shop till at least September or October.

The MEN OF OREMS will be selling Hot Dogs, and Hamburgers on the Saturday that the Thrift shop is open. Stop by to shop and buy your lunch to support Orems church.

This connection was truly missed by the men and the volunteers. Pastor Gail is on the Board of Directors for the Streets of Hope and will be able to keep us up to date on the improvements. Please keep this mission in prayer.

Healing Service

On Sunday June 27th as you entered the church for worship, each member was given a piece of paper and a piece of cloth for the sermon and healing service. The Paper was to write requests for healing prayers. The cloth was to remind the recipient of

the hem of Jesus' garment that the woman touched for healing (found in the gospel of Mark 5:21-43) Now there was a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years. She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, for she said, "If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well." Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my clothes?" And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, 'Who touched me?"" He looked all around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell

down before him, and told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."
