A Celebration Of Blessings Sunday, September 12 at 10 AM

We've been through so much during the past 18 months. A global pandemic put lives, livelihoods, and businesses at risk. For many months we were unable to gather as a church family; we were unable to gather with extended family members or friends; many of the activities that once filled our lives with joy and purpose were suspended; even our normal grieving traditions were postponed or greatly altered. And, even with the gift of highly effective vaccines, we're still navigating many pandemic-related uncertainties and challenges. Natural disasters of many types continue to emerge around the globe.

And a stressful political climate continues to divide us and set us on edge.

We feel disappointed and overwhelmed! We feel stressed, sometimes to the breaking point!

We wonder how to respond as disciples of Jesus Christ.

It would be easy to focus on the losses and stresses of the past 18 months (and earlier). But a more biblical response is to focus on our blessings. In the words of the Apostle Paul (written from his prison cell):

Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise,

think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you. Philippians 4:4-9 NRSV

CHURCH HISTORY- 248 YEARS OF WORSHIP

Our first worship service conducted by Francis Asbury was in the home of Mr. Joseph Armstrong at Middle River Neck "where there was a good prospect" in September 1773. "He was greatly blest while dispersing the word to a large congregation at Mr. Armstrong's in Middle River Neck" as he recorded on September 13, 1773 in his journal. He wrote on February 21, 1774 he "rode to Middle River and had the satisfaction of seeing our new house raised and covered." It stood until 1831 when it was destroyed by fire. This did not deter the faith of the people. They immediately built another on the same site. This new building was named Orams Meeting House after a trustee whose name was Henry Orams. The spelling of Orams to Orems changed sometime between 1831 and 1859.
