PRAYER ROOM

This room was created several years ago during a 24 hour 7 day Prayer campaign. The



Prayer room is still in our Education building. It is a room set aside for quiet meditation or for loud praising or whatever you do to connect to God. We have clay to mold while you pray, or pebbles to hold or paper to draw on. There are books for inspiration and a log to write down your prayer requests and thanks when they are answered. There is music available and a rocking chair to sit and feel God's love. You can use this room at any time day or night. There is a key lock on the door to the building. Use the code to open the box and retrieve the key. Then you can open the door.

Please remember to return the key to the lock box. If you need the code for the lock box, contact the church office. Once you arrive, you may turn on lights or adjust the heat in the room to make yourself more comfortable. If someone is using the Prayer room when you arrive, check to see if a DO NOT DISTURB sign is on the door. If not, then you may softly knock and enter the room to pray.

One Call Now System

We use the One Call Now system to send out reminders and announcements of activities, etc. that we need to communicate to the congregation.

Occasionally due to noise in the line, or a long greeting on your answering machine, our One Call message gets scrambled. If the message does not come through, you will be able to listen to the last message sent through the system. <u>Cut this section</u> <u>out and place near your</u> <u>phone.</u>

If you miss the message from our One Call you can replay the message by calling 1-877-698-3261 and press option "1" to hear the group message.
