Did you know?

On March 20, 1970 a special dinner was held at Orems church to honor Mr. William F. Repair and his wife Margaret Burkett Repair.

On this occasion the Church Chapel was named in honor of the man who had taught Adult Sunday School at Orems for 27 years, had audited our financial records for over20 years, helped charter the Methodist Men's group and was a Lay leader and Board member for many committees over many years.

He was known by many in the Baltimore area as he was often called upon as a Lay leader pulpit replacement for preachers on vacation. His witness and devotion to God was inspiring to all. His picture hangs in the William Repair Chapel just off the Sanctuary.

One Call Now System

We use the One Call Now system to send out reminders and announcements of activities, etc. that we need to communicate to the congregation.
