Trustee Transparency

Hello Church Family! My name is Sara-Beth Dulina and I have been the Trustee Chair at Orems UMC for the last year and a half. I wanted to share some information with you as I personally believe that good communication leads to strong relationships.

Q: What does the Trustee Committee do?

A: We maintain the building and facilities inside and out. Not only the structure of the building, but we also ensure all the contents within the building, the heating and air-conditioning, electrical and mechanical systems, utilities etc. are in working order. We keep track of and maintain all church equipment such as security devices (cameras), computers and copier. We maintain the grounds and ensure they are kept nice as well as safe.

Q: What has the Trustee committee done over the last 18 months? Things appear the same.

A: Actually, we have done a tremendous amount of work, but many things are not visually obvious. We have done many smaller projects, but today I want to outline some of the larger projects we have completed over the last year and a half.

2022:

Installed access platforms in sanctuary attic to allow better access for a/c repair/replacement and overall maintenance. Cost: \$5,000

Replaced roof above the Repair chapel (needed prior to A/C installation and due to leaks). Cost: \$10,200

Installed 3 new A/C units for the Sanctuary on chapel roof (2 of the 3 did not work and were unable to be repaired, the third was at the end of its lifespan). Cost: \$24,900

Trimmed 2 trees which had large branches hanging over the Fellowship Hall. Cost: \$2,600

Begun investigative work on repair of severely cracked wall – over a year of prep work.

Total for large projects in 2022: \$42,300

2023 (as of August 1st):

Removed two enormous trees behind room 100 (one was causing a huge gap in the wall). Required a crane to remove. Cost: \$10,800

Installed 3 new A/C units for fellowship hall/kitchen (had issues with old ones-all 3 were at or near end of lifespan) Cost: \$28,500

Repaired leaking steeple which caused damage to the sanctuary ceiling. Cost: \$5,000

Severely cracked wall repair near room 100 (Cost includes tear down and rebuilding of cinder block wall). Cost: \$8,680

Total for large projects in 2023 (as of August 1st): \$52,980

Q: How are all these big projects being paid for? If we aren't meeting our weekly offering goals, how is this possible?

A: Many years ago, Orems had a parsonage, which is where the pastor would live, and at one point we rented it to our choir director. That property was sold in fall of 2013 and the money from the sale went into a Baird (pronounced "Beard") account where it has been making interest through investing. Per regulations of the Balto/Washington Conference, this money is set aside and can ONLY be used for Capital improvements, meaning building repairs. We <u>CAN NOT</u> use it to pay electric bills, salaries (Pastor, secretary, organist), office supplies, church missions, etc. We try to use this fund sparingly for "rainy day" emergencies or larger repairs. We have just had a very "rainy" 18 months. This is how we were able to cover the cost of over \$95,000 in repairs over the last 18 months. We also have a small Capital Improvements fund which is separate from our Baird account and is used for day-to-day small maintenance items.

Q: What are your future projects?

A: The trustees keep a running list of large and small projects that we would like to and need to accomplish. Some we deem as urgent and try to tackle them first. We also have to tackle any emergency issues that sometimes arise. We have some smaller projects currently being worked on; one is to repair the tiles in the Sanctuary ceiling. One larger project is we are going to begin looking into getting a new door for the Sanctuary basement stairwell. A future dream project of mine would be to purchase a new chairlift for the fellowship hall that would go from the top to lower level (both floors) so our space can be used by those with mobility issues. As some of you know my dad struggled to use the current chairlift because it is very old, so this is of personal importance and meaning to me.

Q: How can I help?

A: You don't have to be on the trustee committee to help. Can you help on one project? Absolutely! Many hands make light work. Do you love gardening? We could use help keeping the garden out front of the sanctuary looking beautiful. Do you like painting? We have a few areas that need to be touched up. Do you have the ability to do minor cosmetic fixes like fix fallen molding or a cracked tile? We'd love your help! If a project mentioned touches your heart, please consider donating your time and talents. **If you have questions or want to help? Please let me know!**
