We are disciples of the Living Lord. Do not let Easter be a one day celebration.


Take the joy of that day into your heart and spread it to all you encounter.

STREETS OF HOPE NEWS

Orems Church has supplied meals for the Streets of Hope Community Care Center throughout this winter season. Our next serving day is April 24th. We will have a sign up sheet with food requests soon. This will be the last serving day for Orems Church until the Fall when the Cold Weather Shelter opens back up.

Did you know that Streets of Hope is more than a Cold Weather Shelter for 20 men during the Winter? It is a Community Care Center for men, women, and children offering Mobile Clinic visits once a month, Shower and Laundry facilities for those with housing instability, case management services, a clothing Closet, and meals every night during the months of November through April and twice a week from May to October.

Streets of Hope has a giving program that gives continued support for this ministry. Here is the Math: If you gave as little as \$3 a month for 1 year it would cost you \$36, now imagine if you and 9 friends gave \$3 a month for a year — Streets of Hope would receive \$360. Now imagine if each of those 10 got 5 friends to give \$3 a month. See how fast the support will add up for them? You can also give in honor or memory of someone. These envelopes for this program will be available after Easter. Look in the Entryway of the Church or ask at the church office. Prince of Peace Lutheran Church is holding a Spaghetti Dinner to support the Streets of Hope. The flier is on the back page of this newsletter.

DID YOU KNOW THAT OREMS HAS TWO SCHOLARSHIPS?

Yes we do. Ruth Bundick and Willard Ray Scholarships are established from Memorials for two long time members of Orems Church. Each Scholarship has its own qualifications.

If you are a High School Graduate, college student or someone looking to further your education, Orems has scholarships available. DEADLINE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS: <u>Orems scholarship applications must be in by May 5th.</u> You may pick up an application from the office or call the office and we can mail one to you. The criteria for scholarships is enrollment as full time student, member of Orems United Methodist Church, and accepted by a college, University or Trade school in harmony with the moral and ethical position and teachings of the Church. The Willard Ray Scholarship must have approval by Church council. The Scholarship Committee will present the candidates for Scholarship at the May Council meeting. We will present the scholarships to our Recipients at a worship service in June.

Ruth Bundick Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship was established by the United Methodist Women to honor a long time member. This fund is supported by the UMW and others who wish to donate to it. Recipients will:

Be a member of Orems UMC

Be accepted by a college, University or full time school (post high school, trade, apprentice). The school must be in harmony with the moral and ethical position and teachings of the Church.

Show evidence of financial need.

Be enrolled as a full time student.

Willard Ray Memorial Scholarship. Established by the estate of long time Orems member Willard Ray. Mr. Ray faithfully modeled strong Christian principles in his personal and professional life. The award is to further the good news of Jesus Christ so that Jesus' followers may go into the world to spread the news of salvation through Christ. It is the goal and focus of this scholarship to further the professional and personal lives of Christians so that they may better serve Jesus all the days of their lives. Those receiving this award are expected to give a high priority to honesty and ethical conduct, and the furthering of their understanding of biblical conduct for their lives.

Recipients will:

Profess Jesus Christ as their Lord and savior.

Live a Christian life as exemplified by the teachings of Jesus understood through biblical principles.

Courses of study should further higher education leading to improvement of employment opportunities, and not furthering recreational, hobbies, or similar activities.

First priority is given to members of Orems who have demonstrated their love for the Lord as evidenced in all they do and say. If no qualified member is chosen, applications for children or grandchildren of members will be considered.

The Orems Council has final approval of the selected recipient.


NEWS from the Avenue
